
MIRO board





PWLP participants to have leadership role in shaping and delivering the Forum

Broad goal: strengthen the ability of the participants to Thrive in Uncertainty (S/School theme) through the development of the power sector's workforce. No explicit 'diversity' theme but inherently linked to developing future workforce.

Size + skills: 100+ participants, mostly technical oriented professionals, including 50+ Summer School, 50+ PWLP Early Career, 10+ API Board members and other invited professionals.

Timing: 1:30pm - 3:30pm, followed by female Keynote speaker (Fiona Kerr)


Room format: round tables in groups of 8. Resources: AV, 2 microphones, data projector



Future Workforce Forum

Roles of the PWLP participants:

- 1. Provide insights on goals and outcomes of the Forum, and on specific activities, speakers etc
- 2. Active leadership of the event (in collaboration with the API team) VOLUNTEER
- 3. Active contributors to the event (part of the 100+ people)
- 4. Craft a group outcome and reflections from the Forum
- 5. Potentially **identify next steps and actions** as a group








The Business Case for Mentoring

Annual online forum featuring videos by undergraduate students on their experiences working with API member organisations over the summer. 7-9 March 2022 1.30pm to 4.30pm.


